Ursula Sleep: A familiar face at the Omni Ambassador East

I work for the guests and can accomplish things they may

think are impossible. However, I believe that nothing is impossible."

"Ursula gives her best attention to all our guests," says David Colella, the hotel's general manager. "Ursula and her staff work beyond the basics. With Ursula's national and international connections, there are no limits."

Ursula is one of just 16 Chicago concierges who have attained membership in Les

Clefs d'Or (LCDI), an elite international society of 2,000 professional hotel concierges in 25 countries. Participation in the organization allows Ursula Sleep to capitalize on her relationships with concierges around the world as she handles guests' requests. The crossed keys she wears on her lapel symbolize LCDI's commitment to service and professionalism.

At LCDI's annual meeting of North American concierges, held recently in Chicago, Ursula was re-elected national treasurer for a second term.

Furry tails wag in style thanks to OAE's new VIPets program

With the Omni Ambassador East's new VIPets program, an amenities package for pets, the furry friends of hotel guests will be treated to a level of service comparable to that of their human companions.

Hotel founder Ernie Byfield would have approved. Originally an avowed dog hater, Byfield enforced a strict no-pet policy. However, it was he who broke the rules when a small gray French poodle wandered into his room, jumped into his lap and stole his heart. Byfield lifted the animal restraint the next day and drafted a "canine code of behavior" for the pets of his many celebrity guests.

"With VIPets, we are formally reestablishing a policy that originated decades ago," says David Colella, hotel general manager. "In the 1940s and 1950s, many guests, including Alfred Hitchcock, brought their pets to the hotel."

Today VIPet guests "check in" with a paw print and receive a "doggie bag" of gourmet treats. The hotel provides feeding bowls, portable kennels, identification tags, dog walking and pet sitting services, litter boxes and scratching posts. Animal grooming can also be arranged by appointment.

All rules and regulations for these four-footed guests are detailed in "Canine and Kitty Code of Conduct," rules to ensure a happy visit for the pets as well as the hotel's other guests.

Colella has set aside specific rooms for those guests who travel

with their pets. "Our housekeeping department takes special care to thoroughly clean and disinfect these rooms for the comfort of all our guests," he says.

A portion of the nightly

rate of \$15 per pet is donated to Leader Dogs for The Blind, a Michigan-based organization that specializes in training leader dogs to guide the seeing-impaired. This program involves the blind recipient of a leader dog in the animal's training. Since its founding in 1939, more

than 8,600 teams have graduated.

Celebrities including Michael J. Fox, Frank Sinatra, Yul Brynner and Shelley Hack have visited the hotel with their pets.

The award-winning Rib Room features an exquisite prime rib meal, a French


rotisserie and excellent seafood in an Old English setting.
